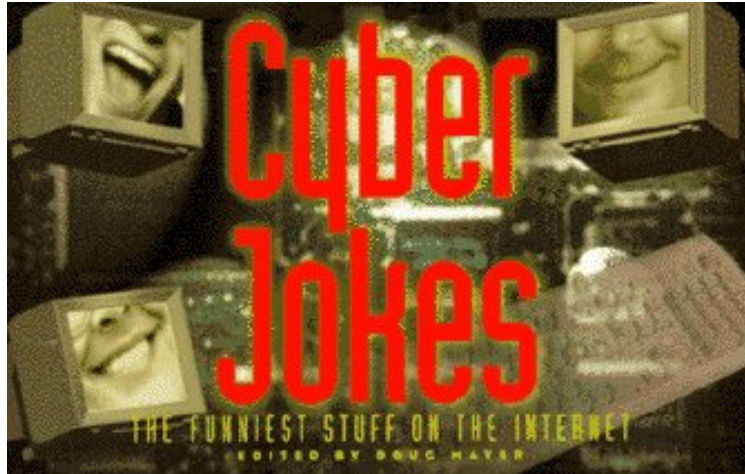

Mostly, however, it's all about the classic lists that have been passed around via work emails for years and years.
