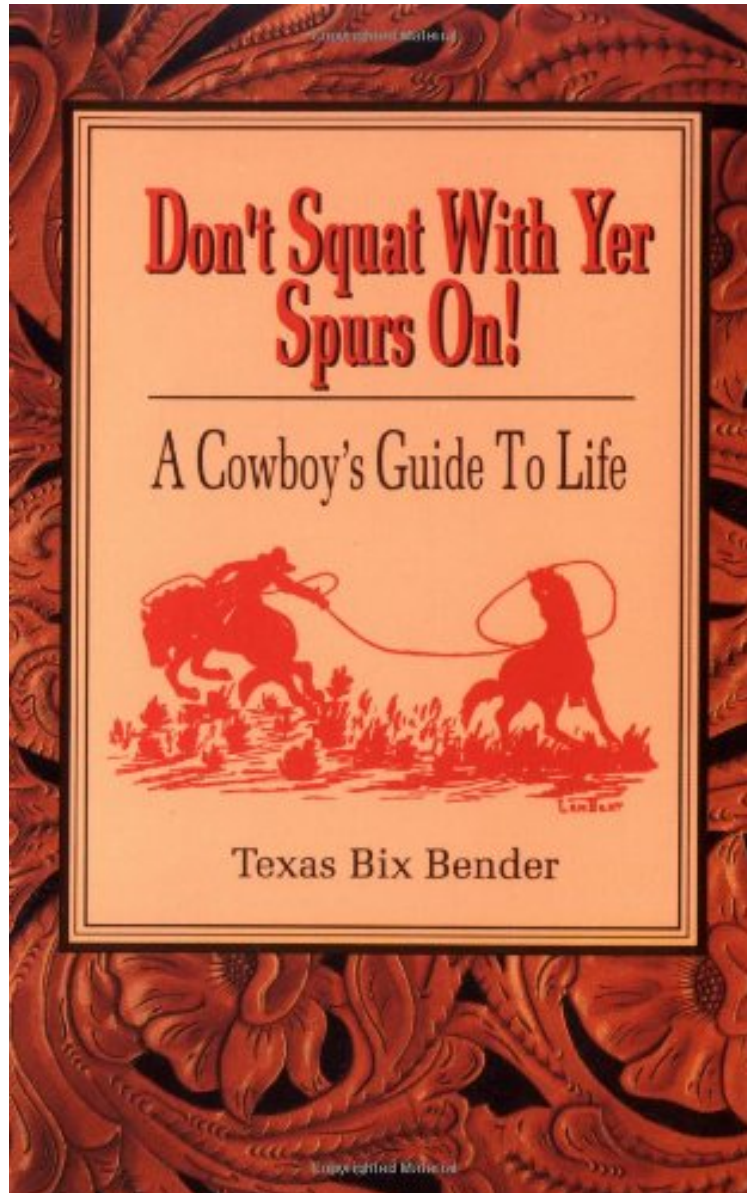

Small black-and-white drawings, expertly done, of cowboy life on ranch and range appear on every left page. Flipbook silhouettes appear in the upper corners of the right pages. As you flick the pages front to back you see a cowboy riding his horse, walk to full gallop, stopping and rearing in encountering a rattlesnake, bucking, the cowboy flying off, losing his hat, getting up, dusting off, trying again. Evidently the sidewinder gets away. The title language reflects the wisdom and earthiness throughout the sayings. "If it don't seem like it's worth the effort, it probably ain't." "Never ask a barber if he thinks you need a haircut." "Control your generosity when you're dealin' with a chronic borrower." "Talk low, talk slow, and don't say too much."
