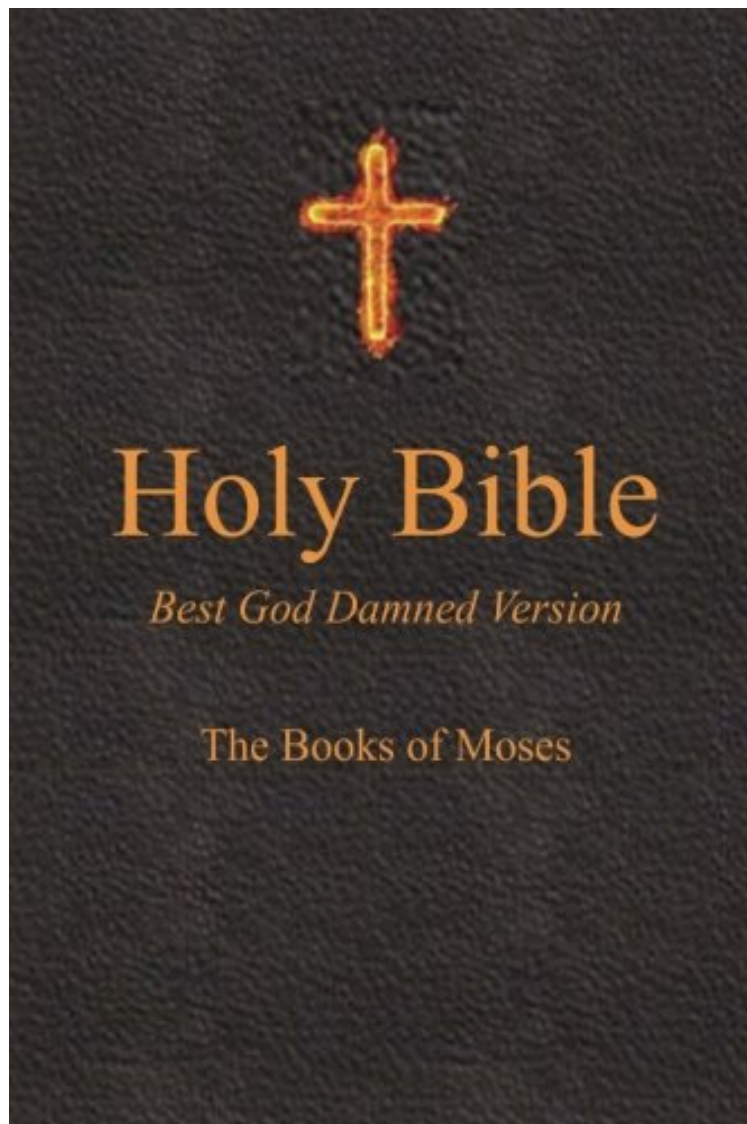

(I gave his first book four stars for editing.) Ebling's latest book shows his writing is maturing. But make no mistake: he has not lost his humor or irreverence.His retelling of the bible is laugh-out-loud funny. The author points out the inconsistencies and the obvious multiple sources that comprise this collection of myths. Ebling calls attention to the plagiarism that forms the bible's best-known stories. Some examples: the word for "god" (elohim) in the old testament is actually PLURAL; bye-bye monotheism!. Cain and Abel are not mentioned in "Man" Eve's family tree. The great flood story was told before the bible copied it; and much more. Ebling's language is sometimes coarse, but the book is an in-your-face examination of a supposedly "infallible" book.Ebling's work is guaranteed to antagonize the "true believer" and make the thinking person chuckle. If you interpret the bible literally, this probably isn't the book for you, unless you have a sense of humor. If you want to read a book that elucidates the absurd, inconsistent mythology in the bible, enjoy the written word of "gods."4 of 5 people found the following review helpful. I thought that reading it would help me to understand Christianity better and engender empathy towards my believing brothers and sisters. There must be something to this Christianity thing. Right?I had to stop because I was seriously questioning the sanity of people who believe in this book. I did not find it to be beautiful or wise. To me, it was violent and stupid.The Bible is a primitive and poorly written book. Much of it doesn't make sense or is just plain absurd. Its oldest books are edited with the subtlety of a weed-eater. The god (or more accurately; gods) of the Old Testament have more in common with Charles Manson than the kindly creator believers keep talking about. And where's the wisdom? There's no real wisdom. It's all ancient Iron Age nonsense!I've screamed and cried and thrown the book against the wall trying to read the damn thing. Why is this horrible book taken so seriously?Steve Ebling's book is not going to answer that question. But it will offer comfort to those of us who can't see what the fuss is about. He doesn't think The Bible is all that great either.Holy Bible-Best God Damned Version-The Books of Moses is a simple work. Mr. Ebling gives us a tongue-in-cheek synopsis of each chapter of the first five books of the Old Testament. It's written in easy to understand language (no 'thee' or 'thou' awkwardness here) and there's no pulling punches. If it doesn't make any sense, he says so. If it's a contradiction, he says so. If a character gets killed but shows up two chapters later with no explanation, it will get mentioned.The genius of this book is that it never strays too far from the source material. Yes, there is some added smart-alecky dialogue between characters. But the stories are presented, clunky and disconnected, just like they are in The Bible with maybe a well-deserved raspberry attached. I found myself going back and forth with Mr. Ebling's book and my copy of The New International Version. "Oh, that can't be right. OMG that IS what it says."The only downside is that The Books of Moses include the books Leviticus and Deuteronomy. Leviticus (easily one of the most primitive and worthless books in The Bible) is little more than a long l-o-n-g list of laws and rules that God's chosen are supposed to live by. And, if you didn't get them all the first time, a 120 year old Moses updates and goes over them AGAIN in Deuteronomy! It would've been a hell of a lot easier if the people who wrote The Bible skipped Deuteronomy and just wrote 'go back and read Leviticus again'. But, what I'm trying to say is, they're both a list of laws and rules. There's no way to make them funny or interesting. Might want to skip those sections unless you're just fascinated by what people thought was important three millennia ago. We don't want to piss off God and boil a goat in its mother's milk now, do we?I still find reading The Bible to be painful. But, Mr. Ebling's heretical writings let me know that I'm not alone. If he keeps writing these books, maybe someday I will be able to slog all the way through the real thing. If you are harboring doubts about The Bible and secretly suspect that it's not what it's cracked up to be, I recommend this book. It should clear those doubts for you.
