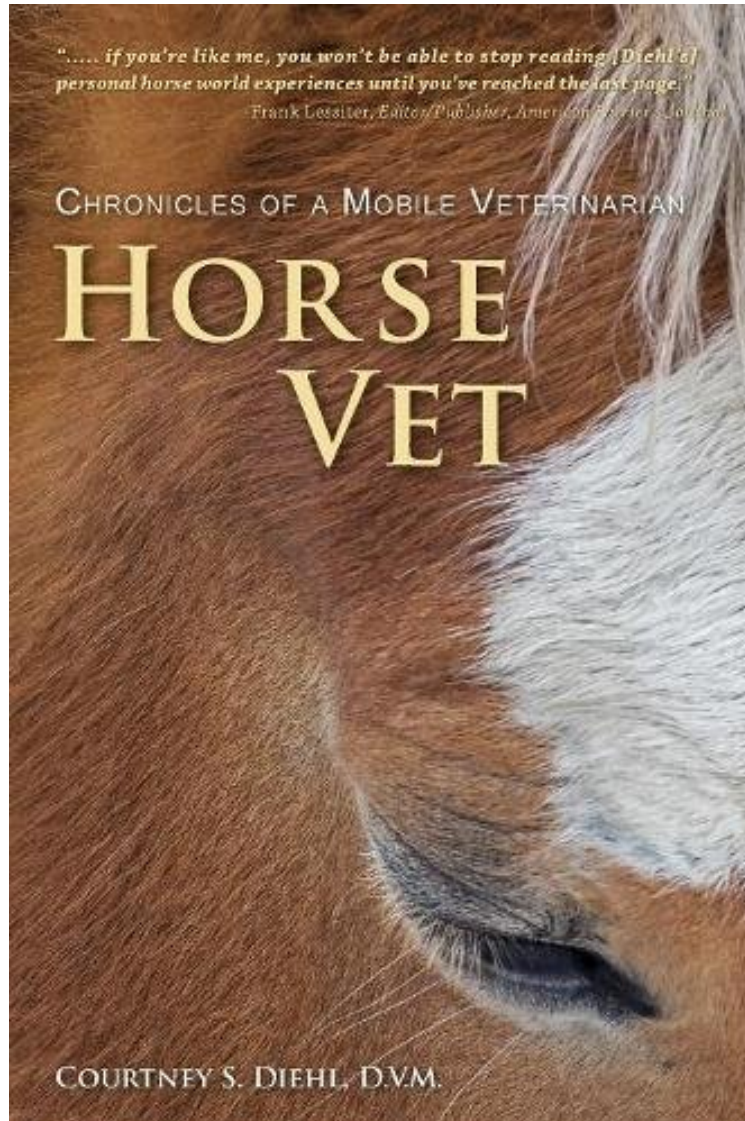

Being a horse owner myself, and even living in Colorado, I really empathized with the author and some of her clients! Indeed many of them were 'clients from hell' as I know some horse owners can be real pieces of work as I

have often observed fellow horse owners when they greet and deal with the vet when he/she comes to care for their horses, even if it's only to give the horse a routine vaccination. Things often got really tense if the vet was there to doctor a horse in the throes of colic or put sutures in the leg(s) of a horse who ran through a barbed wire fence!
