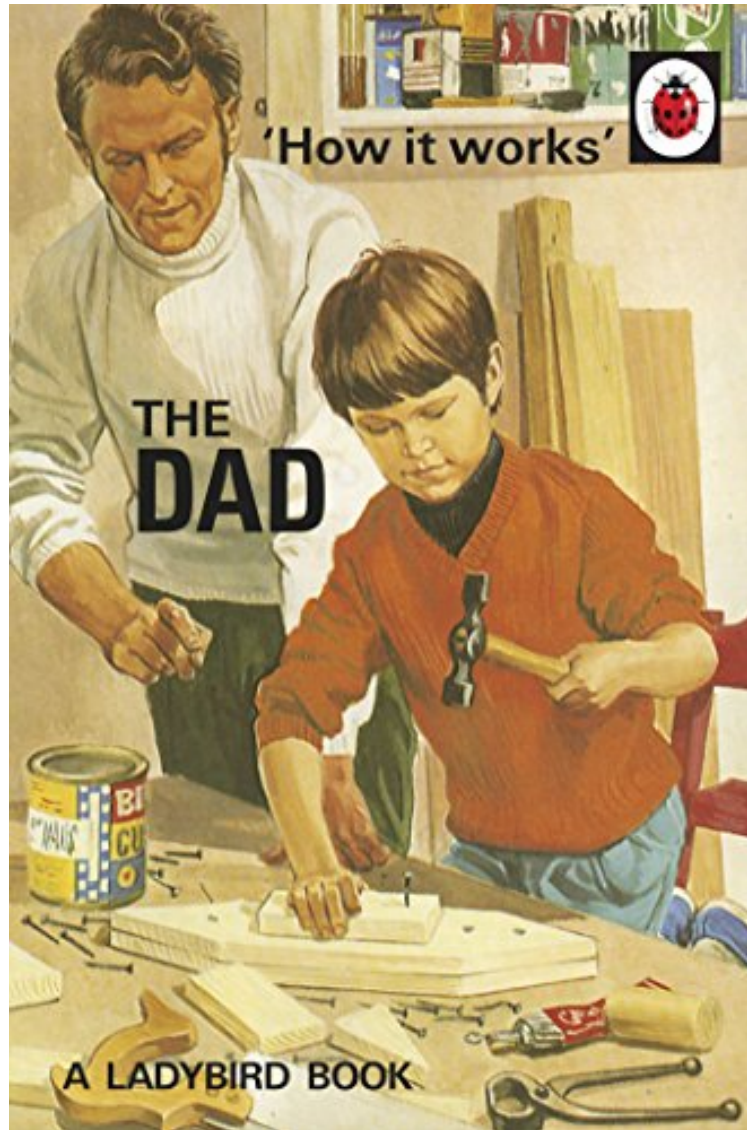

book - it is published by the publishers of the Ladybird books, but is an imitation in that it is intended for a grown-up audience. It uses illustrations from original Ladybird books but adds text written by and for modern-day adults, or in this case, what passes for modern-day adults. This book presents a set of 24 two-page chapters, each one containing a classic Ladybird illustration with a page of text describing a modern-day situation involving a dad and his dysfunctional relationship with his family and children. Apart from one or two genuinely sad chapters, they are mostly about middle-class, well-educated no-longer-as-young-as-they-thought-they-were men who have no idea how to cope with life, or even enjoy it. Imagine the panel of Mock the Week having a go at modern family life, but without the genuine humour that they would deploy. It really is sad.
