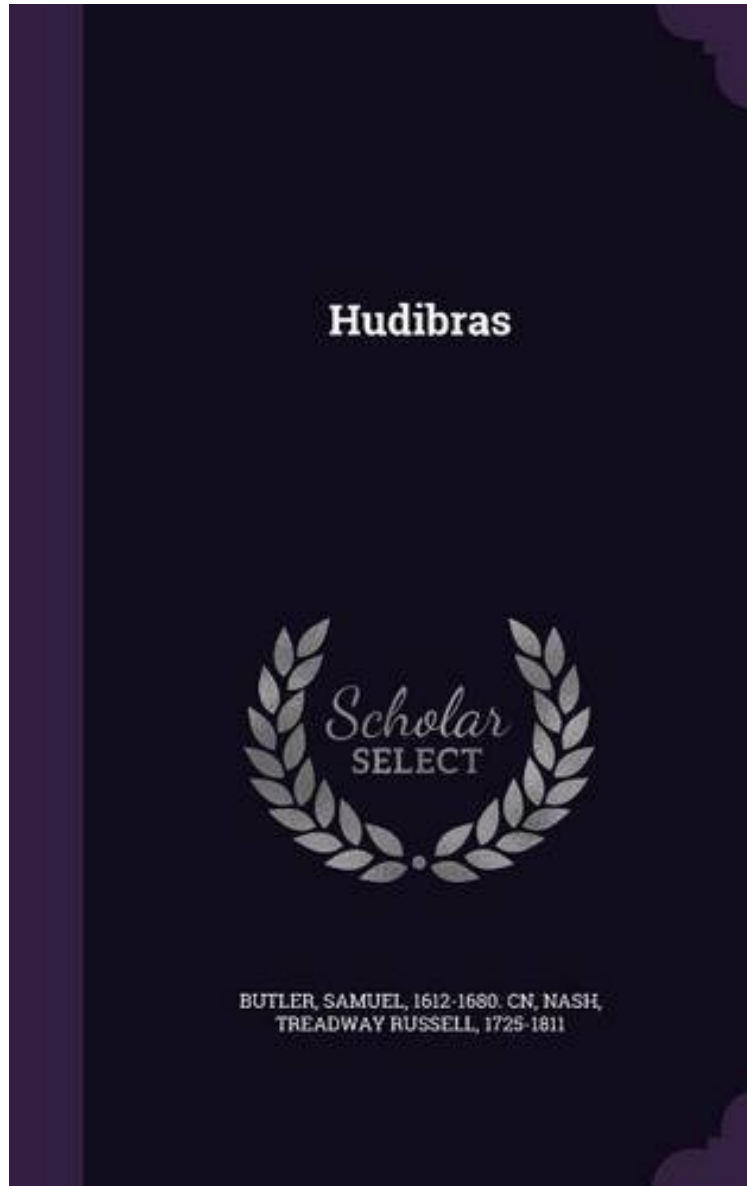

The author of this work was the Samuel Butler of the 17th century, a favorite of Charles II and a popular poet and satirist. Quite a shoddy, lazy mistake... The poor effort here has disinclined me from purchasing this electronic version.
