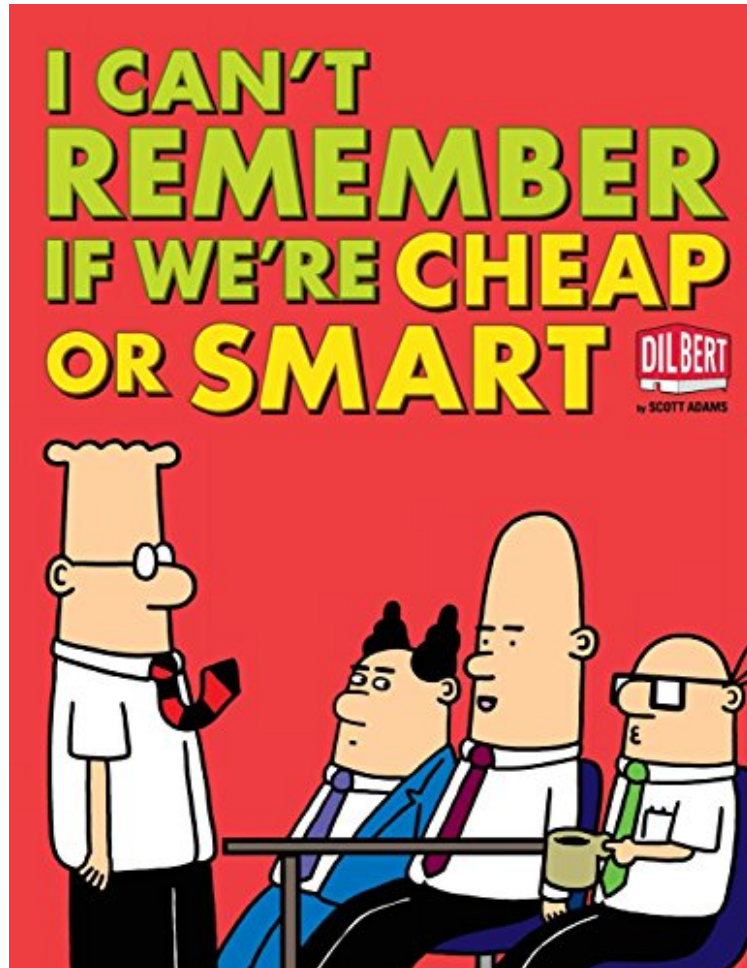

Retread times twoBy Left in OKIn addition to my disappointment that Scott Adams has put out, yet again, another book that doesn't package recent strips (say, covering 2010-2011) in chronological order, I discovered at least three strips that were duplicated within the book. Strips appearing on pages 106 (Ratbert's dream of becoming a sadist), 115 (Bob and Ratbert worshipping Dogbert), and 131 (pirate CEO Dogbert ransoming back employees to himself) appear AGAIN on pages 165 (1) and

167 (2). There are probably more. Like other reviews posted here, I too am done ever buying another Dilbert collection. I own most but not all of the previous 38 books, having successfully avoided one or two like this one that jumbled strips from the whole history of Dilbert in a random order, but this one slipped through my net. Part of me thinks that this was the ironic intention of the book; after all, look at the title. Well, I'm getting smart and am going to be cheap -- I'm not buying any more of these "collections" that sprinkle in a few recent strips with older ones, in no particular order, and with duplicates. 5 of 5 people found the following review helpful. Dilbert is always funny, but...By The DragonAs most of the other reviewers have already noted, this is a book of previously released material, and it wasn't clearly stated in the description. What I found more distressing, though, was the number of repeated panels with in the book itself.
