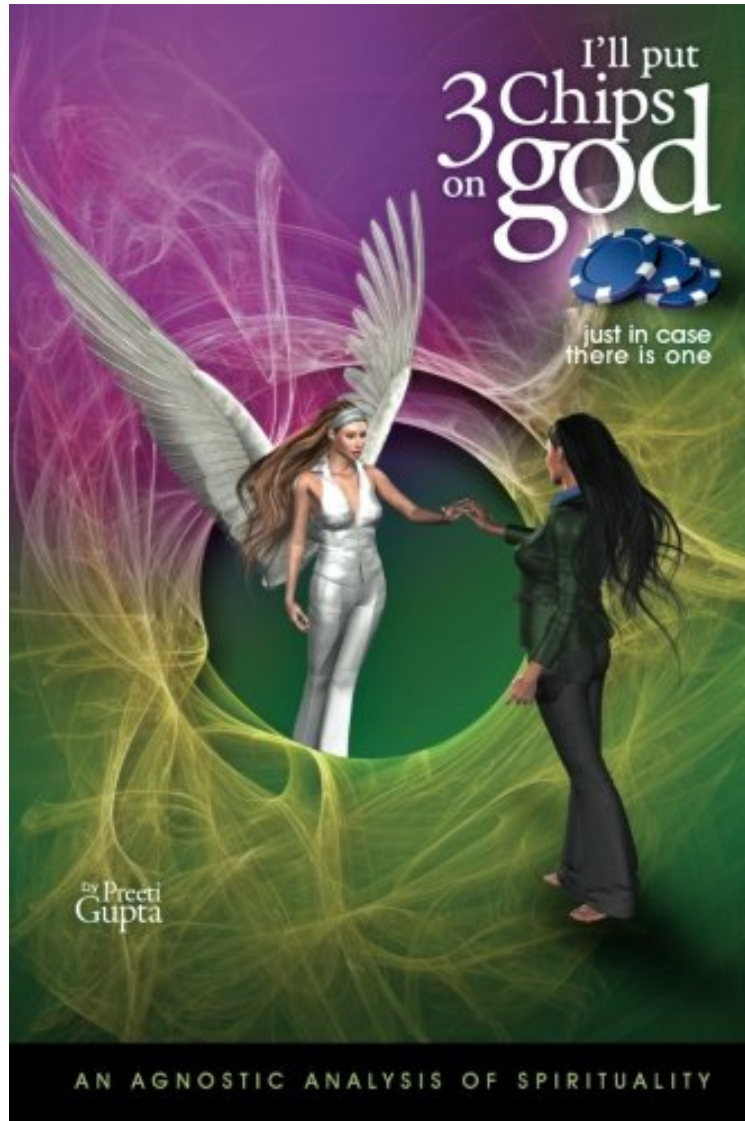


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I'll Put 3 Chips On God: just in case there is one

My only criticism is that logic utilized to reach a conclusion seems a bit scattered at times.
