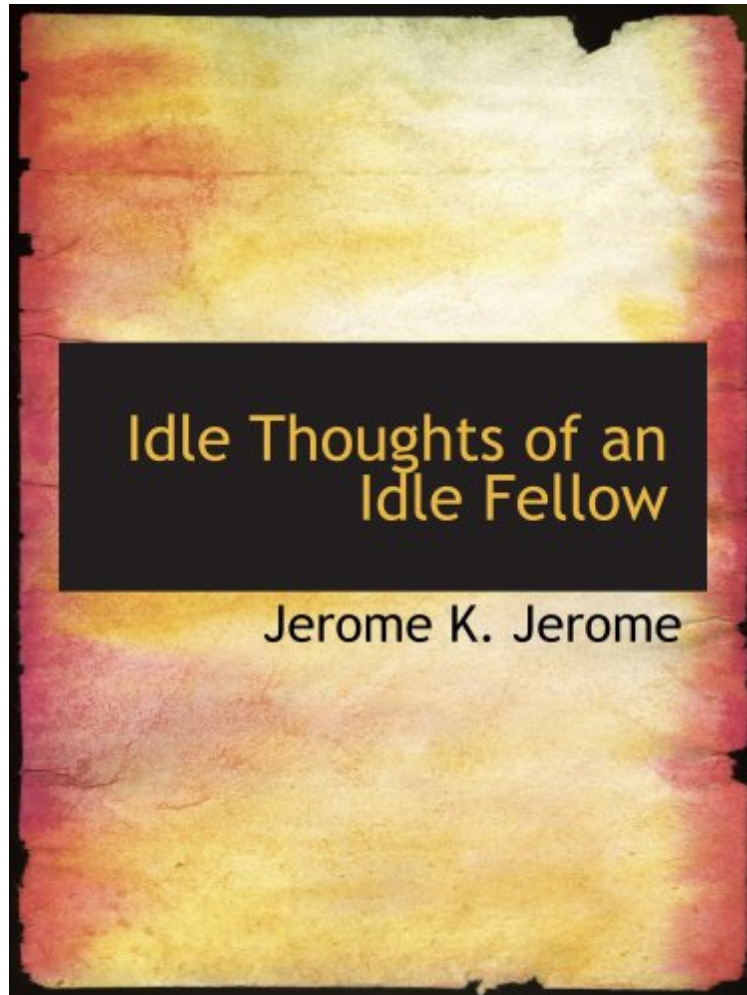

About the Author Jerome Klapka Jerome is best known for his humorous travelogue *Three Men in a Boat (To Say Nothing of the Dog)*, a humorous novel about a trip up the Thames. Jerome was brought up in poverty in London, but the publication of *Three Men in a Boat* in 1889 made him instantly rich and famous. Later in life, he was popular as a lecturer and was hired in preference to Kipling to be editor of *The Idler* in 1892. During World War I, he volunteered as an ambulance driver.
