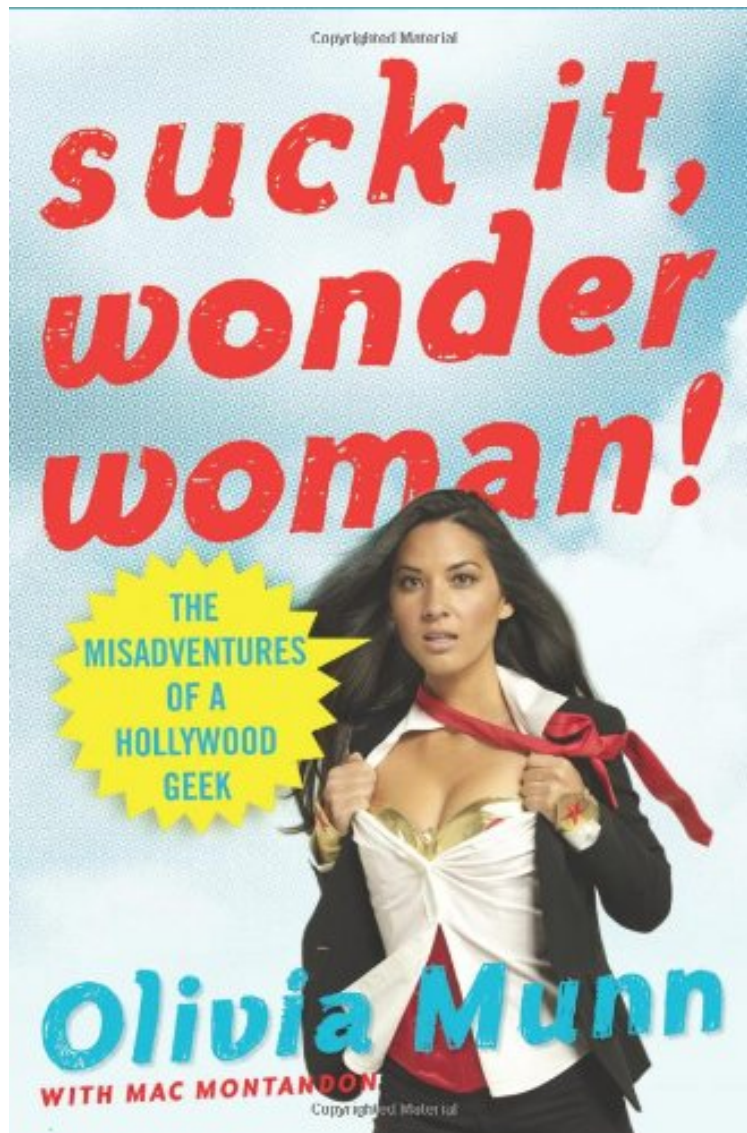

By CustomerI would not say that this was a bad book or even that I didn't enjoy reading parts it. I will say however that it was not worth the money I spent on it. There are several reasons for this. First of all, I was not a fan of Olivia Munn when I purchased the book. I'd never even heard the name. I guess if had known about her and wanted to read about

the hard times she had fitting in during highschool, stories about famous people that tried to get her in bed with them, chapters devoted to proving her geek knowledge, and a random sad story about a loved one, I would have been satisfied. Secondly, I found her insistence that she was not just another woman in Hollywood getting by on her looks very annoying. Why it annoys me so much is that she blatantly uses her sex appeal to sell this book. There are over twenty pictures of her spread throughout the book, half of which were pg-13 sexual. She makes plenty of flirtatious and sexual comments that are scattered throughout the book. This does not bother me, it is that she constantly acts as if she's just some geek girl.
